CAPITAL CONTRIBUTIONS

Airport improvements - Pilot's lounge, rental hangar for overnight, hard surface crosswind runway, welcome sign

Art Center - Auditorium (100 seats), music/dance rooms, art gallery, children's museum, book store, artist studio, arts organization office. Possibly rent space for artists center

Band Shell - Might be part of Arts Center

Community Events Center - Multi-purpose venue for community events

Glenn Miller Big Band Museum

Hospice/Alzheimer unit

Improve UHF antenna booster

Lied Center Expansion - Separate/suspended walking track, tennis court, private spa rooms, expanded weight training and exercise class space

New Hospital - to include rehabilitation center

Nodaway Valley Historical Society - Museum expansion such as building for Indian artifacts and building around jail

Outdoor aquatic facility

Outdoor amphitheatre

Outdoor Educational Learning Center - Page County Conservation/Former Amvets area

Residential facility for severely disabled

Spec Housing and/or Spec Business Building - including senior-friendly housing

Parks expansion - Additional baseball diamonds, soccer fields, resurface tennis courts, new playground equipment, camping/cabins



SMALLER CONTRIBUTIONS

Continuing education - Personal improvement areas of technology, health and wellness, nutrition, etc.

Fairgrounds - Pave driveway, air condition Cow Palace, new grandstand, expansion

Glenn Miller Birthplace Society- Stage, lighting, sound equipment for festival performances; Glenn Miller statue at Birthplace Home.

Lied Public Library expansion of programs - Multi-media equipment for large meeting room; Funds to purchase books; Funds for reference materials; Funds to maintain and replace technology; Signage; Outdoor seating

Parks - Restrooms, new playground equipment, flower gardens, picnic tables, grills, artwork, fountain. Expand playground facilities.

SUSTAINING OPERATIONAL ENDOWMENTS

Accessibility - Loan funds to make public and private buildings easily accessible

Arts Council - Support establishment of director and assorted programs; Scholarship assistance for lessons, camp experience, programs; Fund internship for IWCC student; Traveling theatre programs; Music events on the square; Summer arts/theatre camp; Municipal Band; Movies on the square; Thursday night programs; Cultural events

Clarinda Community Schools - Auditorium maintenance and improvements; Band instruments for low income; Scholarships - college bound music and arts students

Congregate Meals and Senior Center Activities - Support locally operated program for seniors

Economic Development - Operational funds; Assistance for building restoration/upper story restoration around square, existing business expansion, historical restoration research

GMBS - Existing scholarship competition program; Festival expenses; General operating expenses

Health and Wellness - Operational funds for groups focused on mental and physical health as non-profit organizations

Housing and Assisted Living - Fund to help with costs

Lied Center - Operational funds; Memberships; Wellness oriented programs

Lied Public Library - Operational funds

Nodaway Valley Free Clinic - Operational Funds

Respite Care - Operational Funds

RSVP - Operational funds; Reimbursement for volunteer expenses

Senior Services - Fund to provide senior home-based services outside of Medicare designated services.
